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Ballot Results

88 valid ballots were returned, which is a real good response. In regard to Question #1 on rear yard landscaping:



- 18 were for having no restrictions,
- 30 were for retaining some control, but not actively enforcing landscaping rules in the rear yard, and
- 40 were for not changing the rules at all.

Because a majority of 67 is required to pass any change to the Policies & Guidelines, no change will be made as to how rear yard landscaping will be handled.

How active the enforcement of those restrictions will continue to be is up to each Association Board. The current board will continue to operate as we have in the past, enforcing the rules for violations that can be seen by the Property Manager when he goes through the community, but he will not actively search for violations in our residents' back yards.

Regarding the 2nd question in regard to Commercial Vehicles:

- 39 favored changing the definition of commercial vehicles, and
- 49 did not.

Again, because we did not receive 67 votes in favor of changing the current definition, it will stay as is. The Board wishes to thank every homeowner who voted and returned ballots — as this is your community and this is the process by which you control what happens here.

Color Pallet Expansion

For homeowners who may be planning on repainting their homes in the near future, another ballot question is expected to be put out in the next few months regarding the expansion of the current paint pallet to add some darker colors.

As you may have noticed, we currently have very little variation in the five (5) approved house colors, and this

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will be an opportunity to have more color variety. Any proposed new colors will conform to the latest requirements for the North Scottsdale area, which is a Light Reflective Value (LRV) of 35% or less.

Homeowners are reminded that a Architectural Request Form must be submitted to the Architectural Committee prior to repainting your home, but approval is usually granted within one day, provided one of the currently approved colors is specified, and you do not intend to use an accent color. Requests containing the use of accent colors on pop-out areas must go through the normal full approval process.

Brush/Bulk Trash Collection

A number of homeowners are placing yard waste out for pickup long before the scheduled pick-up date. Because this compromises the



appearance of our community, we will be enforcing the City's Nine-Day Rule of not placing items out for pickup more than nine (9) days prior to the scheduled pick-up date.

While the City publishes this information in our monthly water/garbage bill, we will also make every attempt to inform our homeowners as to when the City has scheduled the monthly pick-up for our area. For now, the schedule and rules regarding brush and bulk trash pickup is on the Carriage Trails website.



Thus, you may view this attractive natural desert landscape, and if you desire, you may respectfully walk through it. However, it is absolutely in violation of the Scottsdale Ordinance — and thus unlawful — to pile trash or plant clippings in it, ride bikes in it, build anything in or upon it, dig up the plants (or plant any new plants), or even remove dead plant material from any portion of the NAOS. In short, the NAOS is off limits — and it must remain that way.

By a Covenant that appears on each of the recorded Carriage Trails Subdivision maps, the *responsibility for the maintenance* of all of the NAOS is specifically imposed upon the Carriage Trails Homeowners Association. That's us - all of us - and if aCarriage Trails homeowner or a member of his or her family violates the law and damages the NAOS by doing something in the NAOS that is against the law, it is up to the Homeowners Association to fix it — and it's the offending homeowner that will have to pay for it. It would be entirely unfair to all of the other members of the Association — and that's all of us who own homes in Carriage Trails — if the unlawful actions of any single homeowner should be permitted to impose this cost upon the rest of us... so please remember to treat the NAOS with care.

registered and driven by a licensed driver are not permitted on them.


